As proof of PSU's tradition of excellence, we have produced topnotchers in the Fisheries Technologist Examination (Top 5); Registered Electrical Engineer (Top 9), Registered Master Electrician Board Examinations (Top 6, 9 and 10) and Licensure for Teacher Education (Top 2, 8 and 9) last September, October and November 2021 board examinations, respectively.



Mr. John Patrick Manuel Dizon ranked 5th among the 211 who passed the Fisheries Technologist Licensure Examination given by the Board of Fisheries in Manila, Baguio, Cagayan De Oro, Cebu, Davao, Iloilo, Legazpi, Lucena, Tacloban, Tuguegarao and Zamboanga this October 2021.

Indeed, there are no secrets to success, it is a matter of preparation, hard work, and learning from failure. With that we give our warmest congratulations to Engr. ANGELO CATABAY MAGNO of Pangasinan State University Urdaneta City Campus, a topnotcher ranking the 9th place out of the 6,474 takers with a passing rate of 91.00% on the November 2021 Civil Engineering Licensure Exam. PSUnians from Urdaneta City (UC), Lingayen(LC), and Bayambang (BC) Campus made it to the top (10) of the 2021 Licensure Examination for Teachers (LET) results released by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) on November 29, 2021.



Ranking second place in the LET-Elementary Level is Joel John Salamanca Agne of PSU–UC with an exceptional rating of 91.6 %.



Also in the same elementary level is the eight placer, Alyssa Marfil Duran of PSU-BC a 90.4% rating.




Taking the ninth in line in the LET for Secondary Level is Coreta Sagun Santillan of PSU-LC with a rating of 91.4%.

Proving dominance once again, PSU-Urdaneta City Campus emerged as the Top Performing School in September 2021 Registered Electrical Engineer and Registered Master Electrician Board Examinations held last September 5-7, 2021.

In the two PRC-administered board examinations, PSU-UC racked up passing percentages of 98.08% (RME) and 96.15 (REE).

Out of 1,668 (REE) and 1,506 (RME) board examination passers, three (3) PSU-UC Electrical Engineering graduates notched up the top spots, they are:



In total, PSU-UC produced 50 New Registered Electrical Engineers and 51 New Registered Master Electricians based on the results released by the Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC) on September 16.

Through the years, PSU has yielded topnotchers and professionals who do not only establish sterling names for themselves, but bring great honor to the University, the Region, and the country.









TWG ENHANCES FLEXIBLE LEARNING GUIDELINES

Future Educators Brace for Practice Teaching

Geared towards gaining fundamental knowledge and skills in the new normal of education, a University-Wide10-day Webinar-Workshop on the use of different learning modalities for practice teaching was conducted on February 22 – March 4, 2021 via zoom.

Spearheaded by Prof. Mitzy M. Macaraeg, Head for Practice Teaching and Review Center and other Campus Officials, the said webinar-workshop series aims to equip practice teachers before they set off with their actual teaching at the PSU Integrated Schools.

The said event commenced on February 22 with the election of officers of the Integrated Student-Teachers Organization, and immediately followed by a webinar-workshop on the use of various Learning Management Systems (LMS) with focus in Google Suite (GSuite).

Throughout the webinar series, practice teachers will explore the integral components of practice teaching suited for online instruction. Among its salient features constitute: the use of multiple online modalities for both synchronous (navigation of Google Meet and Zoom) and asynchronous (navigation of GSuite); Phases of Practice Teaching; Online Netiquettes; Methods and Strategies in Online Teaching; Development of Online Assessment and use of IS utilized apps; Multiple intelligences & Holistic Development of Learners; Lesson planning integrating MI; The 7E Model in Designing Lesson Plan; Classroom-based Action Research; Accomplishing School Forms; Building ePortfolio; Discussion on Most Essential Learning Competencies (MELCs) for elementary and Junior High School; Alignment of MELCs to the prepared LP.

Topics for the webinar series were thoroughly selected to comprehensively address the needed competencies and prevailing concerns of practice teachers.





SOFFREL: PSU SIGNS MOA WITH DOST-PCIEERD

Pangasinan State University and the Department of Science and Technology- Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technology Research and Development (DOST-PCIEERD) met via Zoom on January 5 to conduct the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing of the newly approved Institutional Development Plan (IDP) entitled "Solid Freedom Fabrication Research Laboratory" (SoFFreL).

Present at the said MOA signing were the University Officials headed by Dr. Dexter R. Buted, the Vice President for Research, Extension and Innovation, Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, Dr. Larry A. Santos, Director for Research Development Office and Prof. Francis Albert T. Argente, Director for Extension Services along with Dr. Enrico C. Paringit - DOST PCIEERD Executive Director, and Glenda Dorcas Sacbibit - PCIEERD Supervising Science Research Specialist, Human Resource and Institution Development Division (HRIDD).

Under the leadership of Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, SoFFreL is a project initiated by Engr. Rex B. Basuel funded by DOST-PCIEERD which aims to provide facilities for concept modeling, prototyping, rapid tooling, and digital manufacturing. Said laboratory is the 3rd 3D Printing Laboratory in Philippines and the 1st in Region 1 to employ 3D printing in Metalcraft fabrication.





PSU inks MOA with Pangasinan Organic Farmers Associations

Pangasinan State University through the Research, Extension and Innovation Division signed a Memorandum of Agreement with seven Organic Farmers' Associations in Pangasinan to promote Moringa production in the province last April 22, 2021 at PSU-Sta. Maria Campus.

Participating Organic Farmers' Associations will be the beneficiaries of the Php 4M PSU Massive Malunggay Seedling Production Program funded by the Department of Agriculture – Regional Field Office 1 and in partnership with the Moringaling Philippines Foundation, Inc.

Prior to the MOA signing, the PSU Research, Extension and Innovation team journeyed around the province, climbing hilly terrains and crossing rushing rivers in search of areas suited for Moringa production. The beneficiaries were selected based on their capacity to implement the program.

Funds for the program were allocated from the Agriculture Stimulus Package of RA 11494 or the "Bayanihan to Recover as One Act" (Bayanihan II). PSU is one of the eight SUCs in the country to be awarded with the R&D grant.

The event was graced by the presidents of the participating farmers' associations together with the selected University Officials. Dr. Dexter R. Buted, University President was ably represented by the Vice President for Research, Extension and Innovation, Dr. Paulo V. Cenas and his team.

Conduct of Rapid Rural Appraisal in the 48 City and Municipal Local Government Units Across Pangasinan

The REIGn team spearheaded by Dr. Paulo V. Cenas conducted a rapid rural appraisal in the 48 city and municipal LGUs across Pangasinan for the DA-funded project entitled "Assessment of the Resources and Capabilities of Pangasinan Local Government Units in Providing Agriculture and Fishery Extension Services".

Agricultural Extension is basically the way by which generated knowledge, technology, and innovation are introduced to farmers and fisherfolks largely those living in rural areas in order to bring about change and improvement in their lives. Theoretically, extension should be seen as critically important to agricultural communities as it serves as access to the support and services required to improve agriculture and other farming-related activities.





the objective of the aforementioned project was to describe the current system of Agriculture and Fishery Extension Services of the LGUs, the four key elements of the system must be mapped to the AFES. Catering to the needs of farmers and fisherfolk is the ultimate purpose of the system management. Because of limited period to conduct the assessment, the Rapid Appraisal (RA) method was used in gathering the needed data. Results of rapid appraisals have restricted reliability and validity.

All the LGUs in Pangasinan were considered in this project. Key informants being interviewed were the city/municipal mayors, municipal administrators, provincial agriculturist, agency heads and the PAFC chair. In the focus group discussion, participants were the

municipal agriculturist, municipal planning officers, budget officers, MAFC chairs. The simple survey was accomplished by selected senior AEWs.















In describing the status of the agriculture and fishery extension system of the Pangasinan Local Government Units, the project arrived to conclude that there is insufficiency in the number of permanent and qualified agricultural extension workers working in the municipal/city LGU level. Agriculture and fishery extension personnel also lack the ability to strategize and innovate in developing their plans.

resources needed in delivering extension services are not always available or if available, they are mostly shared by other departments and not adequate for extension purposes among others.

The conduct of the rapid rural appraisal in said cities and municipalities ran on identified dates in the months of May, July, and August 2021.

Establishment of Nipa Sap Distiller for Bantayan Farmers Association

Ethanol production and consumption support the government's effort to reduce dependence on imported alcohol, protect public health and the environment in this time of pandemic hence promoting rural employment and income.

The town of Lingayen has been identified as one of the major nipa-producing towns in Region 1. A team of specialists from PSU has been trained in the methods of ethanol production with reference to the establishment of Nipa Sap distiller for Bantayan Farmers Association. The PSU











REIGn division desires to transfer the technology of ethanol production from nipa to the community as part of its education, research and extension mandates.

A Memorandum of Agreement was made and entered into on May 20, 2021 at Brgy. Bantayan, Lingayen, Pangasinan by and between PSU represented by the University President, Dr. Dexter R. Buted and the BLP Farmers and Irrigators Association, Inc. represented by the Association President, Mr. Tony R. Ferrer as the technology-taker. On behalf of the university president, Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, VP for REIGn attended said MOA signing.

Both parties mutually agreed that PSU shall be responsible in the transfer and operation of the distiller and that the technology taker shall provide and maintain safe bunkhouse, electricity, and water supply for the facility as one of his responsibilities.

















PSU-DOST 1 FOOD INOVATION CENTER: Delivering Productive Outputs in the New Normal

The PSU-DOST1 Food Innovation Center as other agencies had been, also suffered with the aftereffects of the COVID -19 pandemic. Despite these challenges, the FIC continuously develops, sustains, and delivers relevant services, timely turns food concepts to products, and technology transfer to the food industries and other clients.

The Food Innovation Center completed a research project entitled "Transforming Region 1 Vegetables (Eggplant, Mungbean, Squash, and Lasona) to Value Added Products Using Appropriate Technologies" which is a Department of Agriculture (DA) grant funded project for a total of Php 900,000.00 which was presented to the Department of Agriculture last April 30, 2021.

Region 1 vegetable crops such as eggplant, mungbean, squash and lasona through innovative product development were processed to value added products using appropriate technologies such as vacuum frying, cabinet drying, water retort processing and pickling. The Food Innovation Center was able to develop eight (8) products namely: 1) vacuum fried shallots 2) cabinet dried shallots 3) vacuum fried squash 4) cabinet dried squash 5) squash pesto sauce 6) pickled eggplant 7) eggplant dip and 8) mung bean non-dairy milk. Sensory profile, physico-chemical and microbial qualities were determined acceptable and safe for consumption. Appropriate packaging material of the innovative products was identified for each product. Package of technologies were prepared and training was conducted, the farmers being the participants.



















The Center also completed a project entitled, "Application of Hurdle Technologies for Extending the Shelf Life of Candon Calamay and Development of Processed Ube Products" which is a DOST-GIA funded project for a total of Php 476,000. Terminal report presentation was held last June 14, 2021 via online meeting.

The FIC was able to develop a process to extend the shelf life of Candon Calamay from the usual 5 days to 3 months. In addition, the FIC was also able to produce 3 standardized process of producing native delicacies (classic calamay, ube calamay and ube buyos) and their appropriate packaging.



In the said event, Dr. Roseanne Jane C. Agustin won 1st place and the Best Pitch during the Technology Pitch Presentation.

Dr. Roseanne Jane C. Agustin represented PSU-FIC and participated in the 5-day training which includes technology commercialization, marketing and branding, business plan preparation, IP valuation among others. After the rigorous training about poster and pitch preparation, Dr. Agustin together with Mr. Adrian D. Veloso and Mr. John Alex Bumanlag, video editors, created the poster and video needed for the Technology Pitch Day.

Dr. Agustin's Technology Pitch focused on Tupig which is Pangasinan's very own sweet delicacy. Moreover, the technology pitch addresses the problems and solutions made for the native food. Pambid, Head, FIC Center and Coordinator, R&D office, Dr. Wilma De Vera, FIC Head Manager, Prof. Veronica Austria, Chair, Technology and Livelihood Education and Mr. Cyril John Domingo, Member, Technology Team have created an innovative technology which prolongs the native delicacy's shelf-life and over-all presentation.

Faculty researchers are Ms. Analyn I. Diola, Engr. Eric A. Cunanan and Ms. Cristine E. 




Researchers produce variety of Moringa dishes

Established through Executive Order No. 448, issued by former President Fidel V. Ramos on October 3, 1997, the award is given to organizations in the private and public sectors that excel in quality, productivity, and business performance.






AAHRMEI honors DRB with Leadership Excellence Award

Thus, PSU shows support to other institutions' progress by opening its doors for interactive learning, sharing of best practices and management processes.




















CHED-FUNDED RECPE GRANTS PROJECT OF THE UP RESLIENCE **INSTITUTE (UPRI)**

The Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC) is a recognition that the specific degree programs being offered by SUCs/LUCs are fully compliant with the policies, standards and guidelines of CHED. To ensure that the existing programs of the SUCs/LUCs are quality assured, the issuance of COPC shall be requested from CHED. This is in compliance with the CHED Memorandum Order No. 14 series of 2019. In case the SUC/LUC will not be able to secure the COCP within two (2) years, the Governing Board may decide whether or not to continue offering the program.

The awards and recognitions that a university has received in the past is a good indicator of its quality and prestige. Through this certificate compliance, PSU ensures that it is always in line with the guidelines of the Commission on Higher Education to provide our students with a quality and excellent education.



PSU finished strong with 'zero' nonconformity record in QMS surveillance audit

As foolproof testament of Pangasinan State University's top-notch management system, a twoday virtual surveillance audit of its Quality Management System (QMS) kick-started on April 15 – 16 via Zoom.













Charged with fervent drive to uphold its culture of quality, PSU led by the Office of the Vice President for Quality Assurance headed by Dr. Elbert M. Galas in league with Dr. Weenalei T. Fajardo, Director for Institutional Assessment and Accreditation, underwent a rigorous two-day QMS virtual surveillance audit with SOCOTEC Certification International—PSU's certifying agency.

Amongst the campuses that came to grips with the 'acid test' of QMS audit were: Infanta Campus (Site 3); Sta. Maria Campus (Site 5); Binmaley Campus (Site 7); Alaminos City Campus (Site 9); Lingayen Campus and select offices from the Main Campus, particularly Admission/Registrar Office, Human Resource Mgmt. & Dev't Office, Plant Facility Development, Information, Comm. Tech Office assisted by Institutional assessment accreditation directors/unit heads, and internal auditors.

Each involved campus/office was cross-examined according to SOCOTEC's ambit of certification knuckled down to the following: Provision of tertiary education services in instruction, research, extension, and production; University level management processes; Performance evaluation, and improvement processes; Campus support services encompassing the period from March 2020 to March 2021. Concerned CEDs and University officials were subjected to scrutiny germane to their internal processes and documentation, and justified how they administered constant improvement throughout, notwithstanding the predicaments posed by the pandemic, and the sudden shift in education set-up.

The event served as touchstone of the Institution's gold-standard in policies, processes, internal procedures hammered out adhering to ISO9001:2015. Chiefly focused on rectification and reinforcement of the identified nonconformities and observations from SOCOTEC's audit of all the nine (9) campuses first quarter last year.

Though fleeting and seemingly fast-tracked, the two-day virtual surveillance survey encapsulated a year-long of grueling and painstaking preparation accompanied by successive conferences and internal audit. A Herculean task trailblazed by University President, Dr. Dexter R. Buted together with PSU academic council and Top Management headed accordingly by Dr. Manolito C. Manuel (VP for Academic Affairs & Support Services/QMR), Dr. Marcelo C. Gutierrez Jr. (VP for Planning, Finance & Management), Dr. Paulo V. Cenas (VP for Research, Extension & Innovation), Dr. Maria Corazon B. Puzon (VP for Administration), and Dr. Elbert M. Galas (VP for Quality Assurance).





At present, PSU ETEEAP offers five (5) deputized programs namely: Bachelor of Science in Secondary Education, Bachelor of Elementary Education, Bachelor in Industrial Technology, Bachelor of Science in Fisheries and Bachelor of Science in Agriculture.

As a SUC Level IV institution, the Pangasinan State University will keep on aspiring to become a better institution as a center of excellence.














"Promoting Healthy Lifestyle Amidst Pandemic"







Forging stronger linkages, Pangasinan State University-Lingayen Campus signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Freemasonry (Moises J. De Guzman Masonic Lodge 161), JCI Pindang Mangaldan, JCI Lingayen Liberation II, and Mapita Indigenous Cultural Community (ICC) today, April 30, at PSU-Main Campus.

Spearheaded by Vice President for Research, Extension, and Innovation-Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, the MOU was signed by Freemasonry Masonic Lodge 161 represented by Worshipful Master, Dr. Arsenio Barrozo; JCI Pindang Mangaldan and JCI Lingayen Liberation II were represented by Pangasinan Vice Governor Mark Ronald DG. Lambino and Mr. Mark Gerry Oblanca, respectively. As the direct beneficiary of community extension programs, Mapita Indigenous Cultural Community was represented by the Chieftain, Mr. Pablo Bacyat.

A cornerstone of future community development projects

Grounded in its four-fold functions, PSU through extension and research programs, inked the MOU as a cornerstone for the "Adopt-an-Indigenous Community" project —a three-year



collaborative extension project between the University and partner institutions focused in Sitio Mapita, Brgy. Laoag, Aguilar, Pangasinan.

Centered on: upscaling farming practices for better production through the establishment of government and non-government linkages to source out needed resources and equipment; advancing literacy, education, and skills development.

"This MOU signing is just the beginning of many projects the University, partner institutions, and stakeholders commit to launch for the betterment of life in Mapita," PSU-Lingayen CED Dr. Lorna Urbiztondo said.

A self-sustaining community

Though rich in natural resources, Mapita lacks the capacity to fully cultivate the lush produce of their agricultural land. The MOU only serves as a threshold for uplifting the community. Hence, throughout the three-year "Adopt-an-Indigenous Community" project, PSU arm in arm with partner institutions pledge in crafting a strategic road map to efficiently notch up the set goals, bolster resources, and outstretch connections; steer active involvement of other organizations and government agencies such as the Department of Agriculture and Nat'l Commission for Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) to enable sustainability.

"I have heard your struggles, and I have witnessed your eagerness to help yourselves and your community, what PSU together with our partner institutions can pledge is to craft a strategic plan to ensure sustainability," said University President, Dr. Dexter R. Buted after recounting on their struggles hit close to home.

Prior to the MOU signing, various projects have been implemented in Mapita, this included distribution of sim cards, tablets, pocket wifi to IP students enrolled in PSU to aid in remote education, and awarding scholarship grants to finish their studies.

PSU initiated COVID Responses

The Golden Lion Pantry was initiated last April 19, 2021 to be able to share to the needy members of the varied community stakeholders across the nine campuses of the University.



PSU-OUS LAUNCHES OPLAN SAGIP MATA



The University's enrollment for the online collection system of tuition and miscellaneous fees with the Land Bank of the Philippines (LBP) was approved and is now activated.

The Office of the Vice President for Planning and Finance Management headed by Dr. Marcelo C. Gutierrez Jr. is finalizing the update of the mother income bank accounts for the different campuses and the information requirements from students as part of the new e-payment scheme.

This allows students especially from the School of Advanced Studies (SAS) and Open University Systems (OUS) to pay their tuition and miscellaneous fees through Link.Biz.Portal.

The Link.Biz.Portal is an e-payment facility of the LBP that allows clients to pay for products and services via the internet from both the government and private institutions/ sectors.

Students can now pay through the internet from the following eligible client source accounts: LANDBANK ATM Savings Account; LANDBANK Visa Debit Cards; LANDBANK Current Account with ATM Access; BancNet-Member Banks ATM cards; International Credit/ Debit Prepaid Cards; and Globe GCash.
