Dr. Phillip Queroda, executive director of PSU’s Open University System (OUS), was tapped to give a talk during the Training of Trainers on the Capacity Development Program for Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in the Local Special Bodies organized by the Department of the Interior and Local Government-Local Governance Regional Resource Center I-(DILG-LGRRC) held in the Province of La Union.

DILG Regional Director Julie Daquioag said the activity aims to provide the CSOs with the knowledge and abilities they need to be more effective members in the LSBs of local government units.



Dr. Queroda expounded on the topic ‘Local School Board as Catalyst of Education’ which aims to strengthen the CSO’s involvement in local governance and in the LSB.
