The walk-through energy audit or on-the-spot check is a type of energy audit conducted in government facilities by the Energy Audit Team (EAT) of the Department of Energy, according to Patrick T. Aquino Ceso III, Director for Energy Utilization Management Bureau.

The Energy Audit program aims to ensure the implementation of Republic Act. No. 11285 - Energy Efficiency and Conservation, Enhancing the Efficient Use of Energy, and Granting Incentives to Energy Efficiency and Conservation Projects.

The Pangasinan State University was randomly selected by DOE alongside Inter-Agency Energy Efficiency and Conservation Committee (IAEECC) to undergo survey, audit, technical analysis, and other research or investigations related to energy efficiency projects.



The Audit Survey provided by IAEECC had three categories such as Office Policy, Best Practices for Electricity Conservation and Best Practices for Fuel Conservation. The PSU received a grade of A or perfect five stars rating, an excellent score for the three.

Present in the walkthrough energy Audit were Dr. Evangeline Pescador, Focal Person Internal Audit System Office, Dr. Claro S. Sison, Jr. Director for Physical Plant Facilities and Construction Management Office, Dr. Teddy Fernandez Coordinator for Energy Efficiency and Conservation Office, Mr. Rennie D. Martinez Director for Accounting Services Office, Mr. John F. Quinto Director for Supply Management Office, and Dr. Billy T. Festijo Director for Presidential Management and Liaison Office.
