## TECHNICAL DESCRIPTION

<b>RATIONALE</b>	<p>Republic Act No. 7160 (local Government Code of 1991) mandates local government units to formulate their respective multi-sectoral development plans. They are also mandated to determine multi-sectoral and spatial strategies, thrust, and priorities, to guide future development, regulate land use, and boost LGU service delivery. It also requires local government units to prepare their Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) enacted through zoning ordinances that are primary and dominant bases for future use of land resources. For cities and municipalities, they are required to formulate their Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) and are expected to revisit and/or update their respective development plans every election year to consider possible change of direction and priority.</p> <p>In connection with the above statements, the researchers would like to examine the land use plan of the municipalities in the first district of Pangasinan, engaged in salt production, whether these are being implemented/followed or not.</p>
