For cities and municipalities, they are required to formulate their Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) and are expected to revisit and/or update their respective development plans every election year to consider possible change of direction and prioritie In connection with the above statements, the researchers would like to examine the land use plan of the municipalities in the first district of Pangasinan, engaged in salt production, whether these are being implemented/followed or not.
