

In research, we have launched the Salt Congress which aimed to revitalize the salt industry and open doors of opportunities for



SG1: EXCELLENT STUDENT LEARNING & CAREER DEVELOPMENT



Curricular Program Offerings. During a span of eight years, the University has expanded its curricular program offerings by adding new undergraduate courses such as BS Tourism Management, Bachelor of Technology and Livelihood Education, Bachelor of Physical Education and Bachelor of Science in Agribusiness Management.

K-12 Initiative. The University also accommodated the senior high school programs during its implementation in 2017 up to 2019 by offering the Academic strand which includes the tracks on Accountancy, Business Management, Humanities and Social Science, Technical Vocational and Livelihood Track with focus on Agri-Fishery, Home Economics and Information and Communications Technology. All campuses in PSU except PSU-Binmaley accepted senior high schools in their campuses.

Flexible Learning. With the unprecedented impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the University was compelled to transition from the traditional mode of learning into the blended mode of learning employing synchronous and asynchronous strategies to continue offering quality education in the midst of the worldwide health contagion. The faculty members and students turned their homes into classrooms and were mandated to capacitate themselves with the technological skills needed to survive and thrive using the virtual platform. In PSU the delivery of lessons is a combination of residential (in campus of F2F) for an hour per week or 8 weeks per semester for a 3-unit course and 36 hours for home-based (off-campus). Relevant and appropriate rubrics to evaluate the performance of the students for each delivery mode used shall be prepared and utilized. It is a flexible learning environment that aims to optimize student engagement and collaboration without compromising the intended competency-based learning outcomes regardless of what instructional delivery mode will be used. The university

subscribed to a learning management system- Microsoft Teams which was essential in conducting asynchronous and synchronous classes given the travel restrictions and stricter health protocols in 2020-2022. Moreover, faculty members were given one tablet each in 2020 and sim cards with free load were given to poor but deserving students.

University Rank. Pangasinan State University-Urdaneta City Campus was included as one of the top performing colleges and universities based on a survey posted by finduniversity.ph. in 2018. With a passing rate of 91.6%, PSU-Urdaneta ranked 7th alongside University of the Philippines Diliman as 1st (98.2%); University of the Philippines-Los Baños as 2nd (97.6); while Ateneo de Manila University (ADMU) secured the third spot with 96.9%. Also, in the rank are University of the Philippines Manila- 4th (96.0%) and University of the Philippines Visayas who landed on the 5th place with 92.0% followed by De La Salle University on the 6th place with 91.7%. Also, PSU Urdaneta City Campus ranked 17th in the ranking of best Philippine schools to study mechanical engineering, according to an article posted by College Tips (@collegetipsph) on September 2, 2018. The ranking was initiated and crafted by Local pulse (www.localpulse.net) which included thirty-nine of the nation's top mechanical engineering schools, based on overall board exam performance which includes number of examinees and top performing examinees and other factors. Further, PSU ranked 2nd among the top performing Mechanical Engineering schools out of 206 in the 5-year (2014-2018) aggregate data of mechanical engineer licensure examinations with at least 100 examinees and above the weighted passing rate of 70 percent. Pangasinan State University is also first among thirteen recognized Higher Education Institutions in the uniRank's 2018 Ilocos Region University Ranking. The uniRank university ranking aims to provide a non-academic League Table of all Philippine SUCs. Ranking was made upon an algorithm including five unbiased and independent web metrics extracted from four different web intelligence sources: Moz Domain Authority, Alexa Global Rank, SimilarWeb Global Rank, Mejestic Referring Domains, and Majestic Trust Flow.

PSU Host 1st Youth Leadership Institute. Pangasinan State University Bayambang Campus hosted the first Pangasinan Rizal Youth Leadership Institute (PRYLI) held at the Bayambang Events Center last March 2, 2018. The event was attended by 1293 participants from Local Government Units (LGUs), high schools of Bayambang, and student leaders from the nine campuses of PSU.

Curriculum Quality Audit. PSU was one among the nine universities belonging to the National Network of Normal Schools (3NS) of the Philippines recognized by the BEST Program, the Philippine Research Center for Teacher Quality (RCTQ), the Philippine Normal University and the University of New England, Armidale for participating in the year-long Curriculum Quality Audit (CQA) process. Through the CQA, participating schools learned to revise and align their respective teacher education curricula with the new teacher quality standards triggered by the K to 12 education reform and as set out in the newly-adopted and Australia-supported Philippine Professional Standards for Teachers (PPST).

Faculty Scholarship Grants. Full-time and part-time scholarships have been granted in both international and local arenas to enrich the knowledge skills and teaching pedagogy of faculty. Engr. Rizalyn Centino Ilumin, PSU Chairperson of the Civil Engineering Department and Executive Secretary of Urdaneta City campus pursued through a scholarship grant provided by CHED and Japan International Cooperation Agency and therefore had been conferred the degree of Master of Disaster Management at National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS), Japan. Dr. Rico Reyes of PSU Bayambang has successfully accomplished his Masters in International Education at Namseoul University (NSU) located in Seoul, South Korea. This was completed as part of the university development program, which took place from August 1, 2019 to July 31, 2021.Dr. Oliver Caasi completed his PhD in Plant Pathology at Chiba University in Japan from 2016-2020. He received a scholarship from the Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. Additionally, 15 faculty

members from various campuses were awarded full-time scholarships under the CHED-SIKAP program. Furthermore, five faculty members were granted sabbatical leave to conduct research and create educational materials. Moreover, there were 76 faculty members awarded with full-time and part-time scholarships under the CHED K-12 scholarships for graduate studies.

PSU KONEK-ICT: Forging of Strong Partnership Between PSU and LGUs. PSU had productively partnered with 26 municipalities in Pangasinan to provide learning spaces with ICT facilities to students. Now, there are four (4) operational ICT-Konek projects all over Pangasinan. Among the 26 municipalities who signed a memorandum of agreement with PSU for the ICT Konek Project, San Manuel is the very first LGU to blast off the said project. Students from Urdaneta City, Sta. Maria and Asingan will roister online learning amidst the pandemic. It is the primordial goal of the said project to hammer out online mode of learning and make it accessible to rural and remote areas. ICT Konek centers also operated in Basista, Malasiqui and Bayambang.

Radio and TV-Based Instruction, Ready for Operation. Radio and TV-Based Instruction was introduced that can tailor-fit every learner's needs, regardless of the limitations to remote learning in their area. This strengthened the resiliency of the education system in PSU beyond the CoVid-19 pandemic. The university has purchased Radio and TV Broadcasting equipment which will serve as an additional platform for public announcements, supplemental teachings and most importantly as vehicle to deliver instruction. For TV and radio-based teaching, the University will soon be launching a TV Program—a program that converts self-learning modules into video lessons that will be soon accessible in USATV.

1st Virtual University Graduation. The University's 41st Commencement Exercises with the theme "PSUnians: Huwaran ng Katatagan at Kahusayan sa Bagong Normal" was conducted on December 5, 2020 at 1:00 P.M. via official Facebook page: Pangasinan State University and Youtube channel: PSU PRPIO. All students were invited to watch the telecast of the said virtual graduation. To ensure the heartfelt spirit of the Commencement Exercises and Ceremony, all graduating students were highly encouraged to participate in the following program segments: Shifting of Abaray na Dayew; Ceremonial Abaray Toss; Pledge of Loyalty to the Alma Mater; Acceptance of Diploma from the Parents; and Induction of the Graduates to the University Alumni Association, Inc.

Gawad Parangal Sa Mga Natatanging Mag-aaral. Gawad Parangal is the annual eminent students' award ceremony of PSU that started on 2015 wherein the students of great leadership with outstanding academic records were recognized. The prestigious award hails the students with excellent academic track records and awe-inspiring contribution to the school, community and country.

Institutionalized Admission Tests. The University improved its admission process in accepting enrollees by institutionalizing the campus admission tests in the nine campuses of the University. Stanine for board programs were set at 4.0 which is the average stanine which led to improved board performance of the curricular program offerings of the University in the national licensure examinations.

PSU-CAT Online Applications. Prospective PSU students can already avail the services of applying online as they express their desire to be admitted in the university 24/7 anywhere in the world through the CAT Online Applications.

Creation of Council of Deans and Chairs and Council of Executive Directors. The university has established two councils to effectively supervise and monitor all academic programs. This ensures a harmonized system of quality assurance for academic operations and governance across all campuses. The councils are responsible for coordinating common

concerns and achieving expected outcomes. They also serve as the official entity for formulating, reviewing, and assessing academic policies, standards, and guidelines. One crucial program performed by these councils is the harmonization of curricula and syllabi for common programs to ensure that no campus is left behind in the enrichment and updating of the university's academic programs.

Mass Revision of Curricula. The university conducted a curriculum summit in March 9-13, 2020, to capture the inputs from various stakeholders of the university such as parents, alumni, government and non-government institutions and industry partners as we comply with the newly released CHED-CMO on policies, standards, and guidelines for each program. These were used in the creation of a responsive and excellent curriculum for each program in the university. A follow up-curriculum review was carried out on May 4-7, 2021, to integrate general education institutional courses that align with the university's vision. These include Personality Development, Global Citizenship, and Entrepreneurship. The curricula contents and tracking of all academic programs were duly noted and approved by CHED- Region 1 as of June 25, 2021.


Departmentalized General Education Examination. The university implemented the departmentalized midterm and final examinations for general education subjects. This was based on the premise that each faculty uses the harmonized general education syllabi for these subjects. This was employed as a strategy to harmonize the topics and strategies in teaching these subjects. This is also used as an approach to better prepare the students in their licensure examination.


Financial Support to Licensure Examination Review. At least five students from each board program who graduated with Latin honors were provided financial support for licensure examination reviews conducted by reputable review centers in the country. Our financial support includes covering the full review fee and providing payment for the students' board and lodging.

Boundless and Adequate Library Services and Support. The university has purchased e-books and subscribed to different e-journals that are now available for students and faculty to access from the comfort of their own homes. These electronic copies are accessed through their respective Campus++ portal. Moreover, the libraries of different campuses were improved in terms of their capacity, aesthetics, and facilities to accommodate and encourage more library users. The university subscribed and purchased library materials and resources with an amount of Php 10, 824, 520.00 for synchronous, asynchronous, and face-to-face classes.


Flexible Internship/OJT/Practicum Program. Pangasinan State University is one of the very few universities that continuously provided academic services and support during the onset and onslaught of COVID-19. Despite the challenges posed by COVID-19, PSU implemented the online internship and/or hybrid internship programs. These allowed students to acquire the necessary skills and competencies as they complete their degree on-time.



They were given review sessions and three-day coaching and mentoring to help them pass the professorial examination and interview. 


































SG2: STRONG RESEARCH CULTURE & TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER

PSU Receives SIKAP Award. Pangasinan State University was awarded the Sambayanang Itinataguyod ang Kaalamang Agrikultura at Pangisdaan (SIKAP) by the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) Regional Training Center I in Sta. Barbara, Pangasinan, on March 7, 2018. This is in recognition to the invaluable support and contribution of PSU to the programs, projects, and other activities in the attainment of ATI's goals anchored to the growth and development of Agriculture and Fishery sectors.

PSU Launches Food Innovation Center (FIC). Pangasinan State University (PSU) with Department of Science and Technology (DOST) officially launched the PSU-DOST 1 Food Innovation Center (FIC) through an inauguration ceremony held at PSU Bayambang Campus on August 11, 2018. The center aims to focus on the provision of innovative technologies and technical services for the sustainable development of industries.

PSU Hosts 5th Regional Agriculture and Fisheries Extension Network (RAFEN) 1 Symposium. The 5th Regional Agriculture and Fisheries Extension Network (RAFEN) 1 Symposium was held at the Convention Hall of Pangasinan State University on October 18-19, 2018.RAFEN 1 has a goal of unifying strategies, approaches and vision of the agriculture and fisheries extension system in the region. The conference objectives showcase the best extension practices of the RAFEN-member agencies and LGUs and at the same time provide

PSU Collaborates with UP for California Research Institute Initiative. Pangasinan State University teamed with University of the Philippines Diliman (UPD) in partnership with University of California Berkeley to become a partner Higher Education Institution (HEI) to make collaborative researches on Resilient Electricity Grids funded by Commission on Higher Education- Philippine-California Research Institute (CHED-PCARI). Part of this program is to conduct research and field deployment of advanced metering infrastructure with DECORP, a host distribution utility. Aside from collaborative research programs, training programs and curriculum development will also be included in the agenda.

PSU-PCAARRD Launches Mangrove Crab Hatchery Project. Pangasinan State University has officially launched the groundbreaking of PSU- Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research Development (PCAARRD) Mangrove Crab Hatchery Project last June 30, 2018 at PSU Binmaley Campus.

PSU Faculty's Invention is Lone Entry to NSTW. Dr. Catalina C. Platon, Director for Intellectual Property, Research Utilization and Ethics and faculty member of Lingayen Campus presented her Instructional Binaural Acoustic Stethoscope (IMBAS) Invention last July 17-21, 2018 in the National Science and Technology Week (NSTW) at the World Trade Center, Manila. The invention of Dr. Platon is the lone entry from all State University and Colleges to make it to the NSTW.

Regional Invention Contest and Exhibits (RICE) Champion. PSU is the Over-all Champion in the recently concluded 2019 Regional Invention Contest and Exhibits (RICE) at Candon City, Ilocos Sur on October 15-17, 2019 organized by the Department of Science and Technology Regional Office No.1. PSUnians showcased their entries along different categories which include Outstanding Utility Model, Outstanding Industrial Design and LIKHA or the Outstanding Creative Research. First Placers in the different categories will move up to participate in the National Invention Contest and Exhibits (NICE) next year. The winners amassed a total of PhP 115, 000.00 worth of cash prize.

1st Southeast Asian Conference on Academic and Research (SEACAR). PSU organized the first Southeast Asian Conference on Academic and Research in 2019 in collaboration with the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education - Innotech participated in by delegates from all over southeast Asian. Some of the lectures were "Best Practices in Initiating and Sustaining Partnerships for US and Philippine Interactions," "Education and Research Development 2030: Philippine Perspective and Engagement," and "Academe Industry Partnership for Capacity Building".

PSU Signs MOA with DOST-PCIEERD for 1st 3D Printing Laboratory in Region 1. Pangasinan State University and the Department of Science and Technology – Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technology Research and Development (DOSTPCIEERD) met via Zoom on January 5 to conduct the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing of the newly approved Institutional Development Plan (IDP) entitled "Solid Freedom Fabrication Research Laboratory" (SoFFreL). The PCIEERD 6.5 million funded project aims to provide facilities for concept modeling, prototyping, rapid tooling, and digital manufacturing. Said laboratory is the 3rd 3D Printing Laboratory in Philippines and the 1st in Region 1 to employ 3D printing in Metalcraft fabrication. The rapid prototyping and manufacturing technology (RPM), is an integration of many different disciplines. It generates an entity by first forming a series of layers according to the dispersed section information of the digital model, and then piling the formed layers sequentially together. With the progress of material and enabling technology, many new RPM techniques emerged and have been already applied in the fields such as rapid tooling/moulding, direct formed usable part, nano-

/micro-RPM, and biomanufacturing. All these will enable PSUnians' to materialize their blueprints relevant to rapid prototyping and manufacturing research.

RDE Explores Pangasinan's Salt Industry. The Research, Development, and Extension (RDE) team explored the salt farms of Pangasinan to survey their salt production, marketing strategies, and demographics. The Office of the Vice President for Research, Extension, Innovation and Gender and Development made the rounds in the six districts of Pangasinan to gather data on the salt industry of the province of Pangasinan. Seven Salt-making City/Municipalities in the province were identified namely: Alaminos City, Dasol, Infanta, Anda, Bolinao, San Fabian and Mangaldan.

1st Philippine Salt Congress. The University organized the 1st Philippine Salt Congress conducted on November 26, 2022 at the Sison Auditorium Capitol Complex in Lingayen, Pangasinan with the theme "Recognizing the Salt Industry Towards a Self Sufficient Philippines". The initiative focused on the revival of the salt production and the innovative ways to improve the old technologies and traditional production processes of its current practice. International plenary speakers from Indonesia delivered insights on the importance and improvement of salt production which will help to increase income, employment, and local production share in the Philippine economy. All researches presented relevant to the salt industry was also evaluated with focus on technology development, value adding and other commodities combined with salt and social welfare, economics, marketing and policy making.

Nipa Alcohol Production Research Project. The University has been working on producing ethanol from Nipa tree for it is abundant in Pangasinan. The idea started during the pandemic wherein the country is facing a health crisis. Pangasinan is the only province in Region 1 that grows Nipa. PSU initiated the said project as it recognizes the limited supply of ethanol not only in the province and the region but even nationwide during the COVID19 pandemic. The University will produce ethanol using the technology developed by MMSU to augment the supply of hand sanitizers in Pangasinan. Further, the team collaborated with other institutions for the said project such as the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and Central Luzon State University (CLSU). The PSU Bioethanol RDE Team went to Brgy. Bantayan, Lingayen, Pangasinan because it has large areas of Nipa Plantation and discussed with the Barangay and Farmers' Organization officials the possibility of establishing a village-scale bioethanol facility in the community.

Moringa Seedling Production Project Under Bayanihan II. By Virtue of the Memorandum of Agreement signed by the Department of Agriculture – Regional Field Office (DA-FRO) I and Fishery Council (RAFC), representing the private sector NGO forged a memorandum of agreement with Pangasinan State University on the proposed demo farm for organic moringa seedling production in the province of Pangasinan. PSU is one of the identified recipient/implementers of the "Massive Malunggay Seedling Production" under the Bayanihan II. The DA-RFO 1 recognizes that the University within its regional jurisdiction have the sufficient infrastructure and capacity to produce planting materials and seedlings. Also, PSU sealed a partnership through a Memorandum of Understanding with the Moringa Philippines Foundation, Inc. (MPFI), a network organization serving the Moringa supply chain in the Philippines in July 29, 2020 in Carmen, Rosales, Pangasinan. The agreement between the partners advances the promotion of research, extension and innovation of Moringa in Pangasinan. The Signing of the Memorandum of Agreement and the ceremonial planting of Moringa activity was also undertaken in PSU Infanta in August 17, 2020.

Research Centers. The University has twelve (12) Research Centers, namely the (1) Food Innovation Center (FIC), (2) Integrated Agriculture Research and Development Center, (3) Center for Hydrology, Aquamarine, Natural and Ocean Science (CHANOS), (4) Center for



Machine Automation and Technology Innovation Center (MATIC) was founded on September 26, 2019, by BOR resolution No. 104, as one of the University's 12 research centers. It is located at PSU Urdaneta City Campus, Urdaneta City, Pangasinan. The center's primary focus is on technological innovation, engineering, automation, and advanced manufacturing, which will support other REIGn centers of the university.

There are three major components of the center:

Solid Freeform Fabrication Research Laboratory (SoFFReL) funded by DOST-PCIEERD, is the first 3D Printing laboratory in region 1 that aims to enhance Additive Manufacturing Research in the region.

Fabrication Laboratory (FABLAB) funded by Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) that aims to support local innovation and improve the competitiveness of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) by providing them with access to a range of advanced digital manufacturing technologies. The PSU-DTI FABLAB is second in northern Luzon.

Mechatronics Assessment and Training Center for Mechatronics NC II, III, and IV is the first of its kind in Northern Luzon, with the goal of improving technical education and skill of Filipino workers, particularly in Pangasinan.









The Integrated Agriculture Research and Development Center (IARDC) serves as the REI center for agriculture-related researches in PSU Sta. Maria, PSU San Carlos, PSU Infanta and other campuses. The Integrated Agriculture Research and Development Center (IARDC) was established with following functions:

- 1. Research in the following fields of specialization: Crop Science, Animal Science, Soil Science, Crop Protection, Agribusiness, Agricultural Economics, and Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering.
- Promote, undertake and coordinate applied research in the sectors/areas of agriculture such as Crop Production, Animal Production, Postharvest, Agribusiness Management, Marketing, and Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering.
- Promote and undertake research on agriculture relevant and appropriate in the region with the following commodities: Moringa/Malunggay, Mango, Bamboo, High Value Crops, Ilocos Indigenous Vegetables, Rice and Corn, Ornamental and Medicinal Plants, Forest trees, Mushroom, Native Chicken, Native Pig, Goat, Carabao/Buffalo, and Cattle;
- 4. Promote and undertake research on sustainable agriculture that will help farmers maximize their profit and minimize or prevent environmental degradation;
- Promote and undertake research on postharvest and processing of agricultural products in order to develop postharvest technologies and new products that will improve the agriculture production and agribusiness in the region;
- 5. Provide development and extension services to the community





that provides a hub for scientific research, collaboration, technical support, and incubation of ideas that lead to a demonstrable improvement in salt production in Pangasinan. Specifically, it will provide consultation, short courses, training, seminars and analytical services such as physio-chemical analysis of salt and its derivatives. The Center is adequately staffed and is capable for serving the consulting needs of the local salt farmers, industry partners and stakeholders. The center was established to improve the conduct of the researches of the




The Center shall focus on the Salt technology, innovation and production processes of the target clienteles improving their yield production capacity. Analytical Services includes physical and chemical analysis of salt ant its derivatives. The Center is a hub for training/seminars/workshop/tutorials on the salt technology transfer, production processes, and academic exchange.

Quality Assurance Era. Under the leadership of DRB, the Quality Assurance era was ushered in. The influx of various quality assurance mechanisms ensured the continuous improvement of systems and achieve compliance to international standards and requirements of regulatory bodies. PSU was awarded the QS Stars Rating System 3 Stars, the Philippine Quality Award, the Institutional Sustainability Assessment, the Investor in People Gold and Silver Award, the Institutional Accreditation, the PRIME-HRM Bronze Award and the ISO 9005:2015 Multi-Campus Award.

First SUC IIP Silver and Gold Awardee. Pangasinan State University (PSU) was granted the Investors in People (IiP) Silver Award in the recently conducted 10th IiP Concourse held at the SMX Convention Center, SM Aura Premiere, Taguig City last May 4, 2018. This marked another milestone for the university as the first and only SUC Awardee in the country to be recognized as one of the leading organizations with excellent leadership in people management. The IiP is an internationally-recognized body with the mission to inspire organizations to bring out the best in its people. Among the awards that IiP gives to organizations being models of good practice in terms of people management are accredited, bronze, silver, gold, and platinum. These awards are arranged from high to highest level of

accreditation. The University continued its pursuit and was also given the Gold Award during the next evaluation cycle.

PSU Maintains SUC Level IV Status. Pangasinan State University is among the 20 out of 111 SUCs in the Philippines which garnered a SUC Level IV status. This is based on the FY 2016 SUC Leveling results approved by the National Evaluation Committee through NEC Resolution No. 001-2018 dated June 14, 2018 and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) through CEB Resolution No. 312-2018 dated June 18, 2018.

Institutional Sustainability Assessment. Pangasinan State university welcomed the assessors and guests from the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) during the Institutional Sustainability Assessment - Self Evaluation Document (ISA-SED) evaluation last July 17-19, 2018. PSU is the first SUC in the Region who passed the ISA-SED evaluation.

PSU Employees Received Performance Based Bonus. More than one thousand two hundred employees of Pangasinan State University received their Performance Based Bonus (PBB) in four consecutive years since 2015 after the Department of Budget and Management marked the institution's eligibility with isolation. The grant of PBB is based on the assessment and evaluation by the Inter-Agency Task Force on the Harmonization of National Government Performance Monitoring, Information and Reporting Systems that PSU has reached its targets.

ISO 9001:2015. PSU has received the Multi-Campus ISO9001:2015 certification by the AJA Registrars, Inc. in 2017 and was given re-certification in 2019. The University also started its journey towards attaining the Educational Organizations Management System (EOMS) journey.

Certificate of Accreditation to PSU Non-Teaching Employees' Association. The Civil Service Commission (CSC) awarded a Certificate of Accreditation to PSU Non- Teaching Employees Association (PSU-NTEA) led by Mr. Ferdinand M. Basilio, NTEA President at Dr. Telesforo N. Boquiren Convention Hall on August 5, 2019. The award served as a turning point for the group since its foundation in 2006 and further reorganization in 2017. It is also a reassurance of continuing improvement in service for the welfare of all non-teaching employees.

Creation of PSU Internal Audit System. The PSU-Internal Audit System is the university's newest office which is created by virtue of Board Resolution Number 102, s. 2019 based from AO No. 70 s. 2003, or "Strengthening of the Internal Control Systems of Government Offices including Government Financial Institutions (GFIs). The mission of the Internal Audit System (IAS) is to assist the University in accomplishing its objectives through a systematic and disciplined approach to evaluate and improve the effectiveness of the organization's risk management, control, and governance processes.

Launching of Electronic Records Management System Project. The project Electronic Records Management System was launched on October 29, 2019 at Dr. Telesforo N. Boquiren Convention Hall, Lingayen. This venture is jointly organized by the Office of the Records Management. The system aims to improve and boost records management as it goes digital using electronic portals and platforms.

Creation of the Office of the Vice President for Quality Assurance. The creation of the additional division, the Office of the Planning and Quality Assurance headed by the Vice President for Planning and Quality Assurance (VPPQA), Dr. Ruby Rosa Cruz will be the implementing arm of all the quality assurance mechanisms to be implemented by the University to usher in the quality assurance era.

PSU PRIME-HRM Bronze Award: Seal of Meritocracy and Excellence. Through competence and commitment to achieve excellence in service delivery, the university had earned Maturity Level 2 in the criteria of Program to Institutionalize Meritocracy and Excellence in Human Resource Management or PRIME HRM- the flagship program of Civil Service Commission. To qualify for this award, the agency must meet the four core Human Resource Management (HRM) systems: Recruitment, Selection and Placement (RSP), Learning and Development (L&D), Performance Management (PM) and Rewards and Recognition (R&R). PSU is the only State University and College (SUC) in Region 1 granted with the said award at the 120th Civil Service Anniversary celebration and awarding ceremony.


Highest Form of COA Opinion Accorded to PSU. According to COA's Independent Auditors' Report, the auditor rendered an Unmodified or Unqualified Opinion on the fairness of the presentation of the financial statements of the University as of December 31, 2019. Unmodified auditor's opinion is the highest form of opinion that can be accorded to a government agency. It means that the financial statements of the agency are presented in accordance with applicable financial reporting frameworks and that they are in conformity with existing accounting rules and policies.

Work from Home Scheme during Pandemic. In PSU, only selected offices and personnel were only open as per advised by the Office of the University President. These frontliners of PSU were the security guards, utility, maintenance, BAC Secretariat, Budget Office, Cashier, Accounting Office, and the medical personnel. Skeletal workforce was also enforced during that time wherein frontliners were only allowed to report at least once a week. The work-fromhome scheme was also implemented to limit face-to-face interaction among PSU employees. Reports, communications, and even corporate meetings were done online. New platforms of communications were adapted such as the use of the application Zoom. Faculty members also made sure that their students are updated as they classes were resumed through online platforms. Students were given a month to complete their requirements by sending them through email or by dropping the hardcopies to their respective campus drop boxes at certain schedules. Examinations were also conducted online.

Modern Infrastructures and Facilities. The 5-Storey PSU Golden Lion Hotel is now fully operational to cater to the accommodation and venue needs of various stakeholders in the province and in Region1. An employee lounge and coaching café was also provided at the main campus. The TechVoc building provided additional classrooms and laboratories in PSU Lingayen as part of the Grand Legacy Building infrastructure project. Sports and Cultural Building was also constructed in PSU Bayambang. 2-Storey Student Village Training Center in PSU Infanta was constructed. Academic Buildings in PSU-Binmaley, PSU San Carlos, PSU Lingayen and PSU Alaminos were constructed to address the inadequacy of classrooms and laboratories. Potable water systems in all the 9 campuses of the University was also provided. Laboratories, libraries and comfort rooms, administrative offices were also constructed repaired and improved to provide better service to the PSU academic community. University vehicles including a bus, coaster and multi-purpose vehicles were purchased to improve delivery of services and mobility in and among the nine campuses strategically located across the six districts of Pangasinan.




Figure 3.1 General Appropriations Act (GAA) Fund from 2014-2022 (In thousand pesos)






Figure 3.2 Internal Fund from 2014-2022

SG4: SUSTAINABLE SOCIAL RESPONSIVENESS



Barangay Forum on Extension Services. To upscale conduct of extension services as one of the university's core functions initiated a Barangay Forum on August 30, 2019 at PSU Lingayen HRMTC Function Hall. The activity captured significant inputs from different barangay officials vis-a-vis potential extension services that can be initialized with them.

PSU Launches SK Mandatory Training. Pangasinan State University launched an SK Mandatory Training for the newly elected SK officials of the different municipalities and cities of Pangasinan: Alaminos City, Bayambang, Binmaley, Bolinao, Lingayen, Malasiqui, Mangatarem, and San Carlos City on May 16-17, 2018. Pursuant of Republic Act No. 10742 or the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015, the mandatory training is bounded by Section 27 - Mandatory and Continuing Training Programs. PSU is one of the two Learning Resource Institutes (LRI) chosen by the DILG Regional Office to manage the training. Training Team includes selected HRMD Personnel as Onsite Leaders, while the teaching staff from served as facilitators and resource speakers.

PSU Partners with R1MC for Mass Blood Donation Drive. A Community-Based Blood Donation in partnership with Region I Medical Center (R1MC) was facilitated by the Medical-Dental Office of Pangasinan State University last May 28, 2018. Also, in support to the "Be there for someone. Give Blood, Share Life" advocacy of the Philippine Red Cross, PSU Lingayen and Alaminos City Campus and conducted a Mass Blood Donation on September 5, 2018.

Disaster Resiliency Mapping of Mission Critical Infrastructure and Investments of SUCs in the Philippines. A MOA signing was conducted between Cagayan State University and PSU on Disaster Resiliency Mapping of Mission Critical Infrastructure and Investments of SUCs in the Philippines project for a safer and stronger PSU community on March 21, 2019.

THE 2014-2022 PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS OF DR. DEXTER R. BUTED 6th PSU President

Bureau of Fire and PNP Conducts Safety and Security Management Seminar. Pangasinan State University together with the Bureau of Fire and Philippine National Police Lingayen spearheaded safety and security management seminar among students on April 11, 2019 at Dr. Telesforo N. Boquiren Convention Hall. The said seminar aims to train the students on basic life defense. The training involves actual demonstration on the basics of depending oneself from an unlawful act from their environment. Said training also emphasizes readiness, preparedness and alertness of everyone during fire hazards.

National Training program for Newly Hired Teachers with DOST and 3NS. The Department of Education (DepEd), Department of Science and Technology – Science Education Institute (DOST-SEI) and Philippine Normal University in participation of Pangasinan State University (PSU) as member of the National Network of Normal School (3NS) in the Philippines spearheaded the national training program for newly hired teachers under R.A. 10612. The phase 2 of the national training program for the batch 2 transpired last September 4-5, 11-12 and 18-19, 2020 with fifty-four (54) teacher-trainees. This training program is contextualized to immerse teachers in the reality of ICT-enabled learning environments. The training is designed to allow in-service trainees to access and interact with learning content online through PNU's learning management system (LMS). The learning tasks and activities were facilitated using varied ICT learning tools and platforms with the best outputs which were collaboratively selected and showcased by the teacher scholars through an e-Professional portfolio.

#TULONGSAPAG-AHON: Insignia of Hope to Devastated Communities. The University through the Extension Services Office (ESO) had organized the --- Tulong sa Pag-ahon Relief Operation to help the victims of the said typhoons. The ESO appealed to the good heart of PSUnians to offer charitable monetary donations for this cause. The University and Campus Extension Services Units have accepted donations from generous donors as well as the nine (9) campuses of PSU. Further, the university was able to extend help to the Taal eruption victims in Batangas.

PSU CARES for Indigenous Peoples of Mapita. Research studies involving the indigenous community of Mapita in Aguilar, Pangasinan were initiated to further the plight of indigenous peoples and understand their culture and heritage better. PSU-Lingayen Campus in partnership with Junior Chamber International (JCI) and Freemasonry organized a project to provide some farm equipment to the indigenous Mapita Farmers last August 25, 2020. The awarding of the donated equipment is a move to put into action and address one of the findings of a study on the IPs of Mapita, Aguilar conducted by PSU- Lingayen researchers.

PSU-DOST FIC Delivers COVID-19 Healthy Food Pack Aid. Pangasinan State University - Department of Science and Technology I Food Innovation Center (PSU-DOST I FIC) spearheaded an initiative of handing down healthy food packs to PUIs and PUMs. In addition, packs of gratitude for COVID-19 frontliners, through the management of Bayambang Municipal Disaster. The Healthy Food Packs given includes (1) mix vacuum fried vegetables (okra, onion and squash), (2) banana muffin, (3) lettuce-cucumber-singkamas-apple-tomato salad with mango vinaigrette, (4) pasta in red pesto tomato salsa sauce, and (5) bottled water which are all products of the PSU Food Innovation Center.

Tanggol Kalikasan Webinar Series on Good Governance for LGU. PSU and Tanggol Kalikasan hosted a Webinar Series on Good Governance for Local Government Units which started October 27, 2020 and culminated on November 26, 2020. The webinar aims to inform the participants on the concepts of coastal resource management and of the status of the province marine resources. The webinar was participated by coastal LGUs of Dagupan, Binmaley, Lingayen, Sual, Labrador and San Fabian.







SG5: RESPONSIVE TO GLOBALIZATION & DIVERSITY

International Academic Summit. The 1st International Academic Summit was organized by the Pangasinan State University in collaboration with the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization Innovation Technology (SEAMEO-INNOTECH) and the Province of Pangasinan and was conducted on May 15-16, 2014 at the Sison Auditorium in Lingayen, Pangasinan. More than 200 university officials of higher educational institutions from Luzon. Visayas and Mindanao and the presence of International universities from Thailand, Taiwan, Malaysia and Nigeria who participated in the said summit. The summit bannered the theme "Maximizing Opportunities for Global Education Thru Internationalization" and paved the way for academic and cultural exchanges for possible collaborations between ASEAN HEIs and Philippine HEIs. The University hosted the 2nd International Academic Summit with the theme, "ASEAN U-LINK: Sustainable Partnership for Cross Border Convergence" wherein representatives from Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of the ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) member countries converged on June 28-30, 2016 for a comprehensive academic discussion and sharing of best practices in education necessary in setting standards for educational institutions in the region. The three-day summit kicked-off at Don Leopoldo Sison Convention Center, Alaminos City, Pangasinan, where 150 University officials, directors and students from HEIs in Thailand, Indonesia and from State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) in the Philippines participated. A cultural exchange highlighting the diverse heritage and artistry of various ASEAN cultures was also undertaken. The 3rd International Academic Summit was hosted by the University on November 27-29, 2019 at Lingayen, Pangasinan.

In 2017, **Japan Philippines Industry-University Research Institute** through the Embassy of Japan, chose Pangasinan State University as one of the main venues in celebration of Japanese Festival to enhanced awareness of neighboring countries on Japanese Culture and

Arts conducted on November 7-9, 2017. Waidako was performed by Hiryu High School students from Japan.

Pangasinan State University welcomed the Education and Culture Attaché Office of Indonesian Embassy in Manila to support their intent of promoting Indonesian culture to the Filipino community through an event called **"Glimpse of Indonesia"** on June 4, 2019 held at the TechVoc Building, Lingayen Campus. Also, a Batik Workshop was organized by the Office of International and Local Affairs and was participated by around 150 PSUnians.

Hosting of International Events. PSU hosted the SEAMEO's 6th Evaluation Meeting of the Pre-Service Student Teacher Exchange in Southeast Asia (SEA Teacher Project) on October 16-17, 2018 at the PSU Convention Hall, Lingayen Pangasinan. University Presidents and Officials from different ASEAN countries like Thailand, Indonesia, Vietnam and Cambodia came to the Philippines for this significant event. On October 18-19, 2018, PSU welcomed the participants to the 4th SEAMEO Polytechnic Network Meeting - Agreement and Implementation for the 3rd Batch of SEA-TVET Student Internship Exchange at the PSU Convention Hall, Lingayen, Pangasinan, Philippines.

International Memberships. The University has the following international memberships in academic networks, namely: (1) AUAP (Association of Universities of Asia and the Pacific); (2) UMAP (University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific); (3) AFEN (ASEAN Fisheries Education Network); (4) AAUN (ASEAN Agriculture University Network); (5) SEAMEO (Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization); (6) SEAMEO School Network; (7) SEATVET (Southeast Asia Technical and Vocational Education); and (8) SEATEACHER (Service Student Teacher Exchange In Southeast Asia).

SEA TEACHER Project. In 2017 the University joined the SEA-TEACHER Student Exchange Program or the "Pre-Service Student Teacher Exchange in Southeast Asia" that aims to provide opportunity for pre-service student teachers from universities in Southeast Asia to have teaching experiences in schools in other countries in Southeast Asia. A total of 136 inbound international students from the international member HEIs of the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) while 72 PSU students (outbound) were deployed in 29 various international HEI partners of the University based in Indonesia, Thailand and Malaysia. The exchange program engages 4th year students in 25 curricular programs whose major ranges from math, science, English and pre-school.

SEA TVET Project. In 2018, the University joined the SEA TVET Student Internship Exchange Program with a total of 88 inbound international students accepted by PSU in Alaminos City, Bayambang, Binmaley, Lingayen, San Carlos City, Sta. Maria and Urdaneta City campuses. The University partnered with a total of 40 international HEIs for the inbound SEA-TVET Program. The students were deployed in 23 industries. Moreover, there were 63 outbound students who were deployed in 32 international HEI partners and 38 industries. Most of the students enrolled in PSU Lingayen, PSU Urdaneta City, PSU Lingayen and PSU San Carlos City.

Credit Transfer Program. The Acceptance of Foreign Students from International Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) for Selective Transfer of Academic Units Program was approved by the Board with BOR Resolution No. 51 series 2021 during the 189th Board of Regents Meeting held at the Board Room, Administration Building, PSU Lingayen on April 13, 2021 via Virtual Application Platform Zoom. The University accepted a total of 406 international students from international HEI partners.

Virtual Practice Teaching Program. Due to the ongoing realities of the pandemic, internships and On-the-Job Trainings are restricted, thus the University looked for other service delivery modalities. A Memorandum of Agreement has been signed during a Virtual Ceremony on November 3, 2021 to seal the collaboration for the implementation of the Virtual Practice Teaching. PSU Bayambang was chosen to implement the Virtual Practice Teaching Program because its education program enjoys Level IV accreditation, is a Center of Excellence for the same program. PSU accepted 17 international students (inbound) from Universitas Pendidikan Ganesha, Universitas Sriwijaya and Universitas Tidar in Indonesia for the virtual teaching practicum program while 16 PSU Bayambang students (outbound) were also deployed in the said international HEI partners.

Visiting Professors/Lecturers. The proposal on Visiting Professor Program in the Next Normal was approved by the Board with BOR Resolution No. 50 series 2021 during the 189th Board of Regents Meeting held at the Board Room, Administration Building, PSU Lingayen on April 13, 2021 via Virtual Application Platform Zoom. There are 52 international Visiting Professors/Lecturers invited to teach at the School of Advanced Studies (SAS) and other campuses of the university. The highly competent professors/lecturers are from Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia, Vietnam and Nigeria.

International Partnerships. The university forged partnerships with various international HEIs through Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) and Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for academic cooperation and collaboration. The agreements/understandings covered the implementation of programs which includes faculty exchange, student exchange, visiting lecturers, joint research activities, participation in seminars, academic material exchange, and the provision of special short-term educational programs. As of December 2022, the university partnered with 176 international HEIs.

SG6: CUSTOMER FOCUS



Installation of Transparency Wall and Wall of Excellence in All Campuses. PSU institutionalized the installation of both the Transparency Wall and the Wall of Excellence to ensure that all its stakeholders get the necessary information they need and that excellent outputs produced are recognized, respectively. All Bids and Awards postings for PhilGEPS are reflected in the transparency wall including financial concerns complementing those articulated in the Transparency Seal of the University. Topnotchers, Student Awardees, Faculty Awardees, Alumni Awardees and Staff Awardees are being recognized through the Wall of Excellence.

PSU Installs Intercom and Public Internet Service. To provide better service to the university stakeholders and guests, a PABX Intercom Phone was installed at the PSU Administration Building. Moreover, a public internet service from Captive Portal was also installed to cater to students' need for internet connectivity. An initial two hours per day free internet access will later on be upgraded to unlimited access. The said projects were initiated by the Management Information System (MIS) Office.


PSU Gauges Client Satisfaction. To get feedback on the performance and service delivery of the University's frontline services, a survey has been conducted to its clientele by the Human Resources, Management and Development Office. The purpose of said initiative by the University is to gauge the satisfaction of its clients in the institution's frontline services in Admission, Guidance and Testing, Medical and Dental Services, Library, Registrar's Office, Student Services and ETEEAP. The results of said survey shall be used by the University as measure to formulate action plans to address areas that need improvement.


One-Stop Service Center. PSU's One Stop Service Center was launched on October 29, 2019 at the Dr. Telesforo N. Boquiren Convention Center. Around 250 PSU employees and interested individuals outside the university availed quick and easy access to basic services of the different government agencies such as Government Service Insurance System (GSIS), PAG IBIG Fund, Landbank of the Philippines, Social Security System (SSS), Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR), Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Civil Service Commission (CSC), and Professional Regulation Commission (PRC).

SMART Infocast. Pangasinan State University and SMART partnered for the SMART Infocast project. A device to be used to implement the Smart Infocast will compliment as an additional information tool to communicate with the students. Infocast serves as an additional platform to connect when there is no internet connection during their learning. The said system will be operated by the MIS while the PRPIO is in-charge of creating information to be disseminated. The project is a response to the survey conducted by the University which showed that there are more than 70% problem in terms of connectivity which affects flexible learning. Another problem is lack of gadget for almost 95% of the students who are from the family of farmers and fishermen.

PSU e-Career Portal. The University launched the PSU e-Career Portal as a platform to let the stakeholders of PSU to meet with industry partners and check on their job postings for possible employment. Announcements from local and international partners are regularly updated on the said portal.






higher performance of our students in the licensure examination in their respective board programs.



He stated, "Failure is not something to worry about. Every failure will make you better. Every criticism is a blessing."


Mr. Dela Cruz shared that the webinar was a motivation to become a more impactful leader to his fellow students, especially during these times when they need help in various aspects.




Some 499 students of the Lingayen Campus are currently receiving their stipend worth Php 1,500 from the Pangasinan State University.





Velasco, a retired boxer from Negros Occidental, inspired the student-athletes to go an extra mile in reaching their athletic dream with his own version of a medal-finished ingredient, 'STDDD'.

The Olympian who is also a winning National Coach, emphasized the value of support from school administration to the athletes especially in giving consideration as they juggle learning and sports.

Meanwhile, the sports center was quickly transitioned to a field of green lights as thousands of students of PE and NSTP in PSU-Lingayen presented a 17-minute nonstop mob dance highlighting the rich Pangasinan culture.

PSU Qualifies for HEIRIT Program Funding

The Higher Education Institution Readiness for Innovation Technopreneurship (HEIRIT) Program is a two-year preparatory program which is applied to ensure that future Technology Business Incubator (TBI) Managers are equipped to plan, execute, build, and catalyze the emerging start up community in the region. As of now, there are 54 TBI facilities across the country.

Having a TBI within a University is an edge among other universities for it expands the role in the development of the region by providing access to facilities to benefit entrepreneurs. It also fosters entrepreneurial spirit for faculties and researchers to commercialize technologies, and it nurtures innovators and entrepreneurs in the region. With TBI, a university may attract more mentors, advisers, and partners from industry.

The objective of the program is to train at least 20-25 TBI Teams from selected Universities and assist at least 20-25 Universities to build the requirements for TBI. It also aims to facilitate the build-up of entrepreneurial culture within the University and the province/region where the TBI will be located. The program handholds the universities in its first year of TBI applications.























Out of 120 HEIs applicant for the HEIRIT Program of the Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technology Research and Development (PCIEERD), Pangasinan State University was luckily shortlisted and was included in the 26 HEIs to advance to the next stage of TBI Application presentation headed by the University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted, Vice President for Research and Development Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, Director for Innovation Technology and Support Office, Dr. Catalina Platon together with the TBI Team Headed by TBI Manager Dr. Veronica Austria, Assistant TBI Manager Dr. Gudelia M. Samson, Resident entrepreneur Mr. Norberto De Vera and two TBI Members Dr. Christian Thom A. Tabisola and Mr. Lester Arandia.

After thorough evaluation of each institution's proposal by PCIEERD, Pangasinan State University was qualified to be part of cohort institution that will undertake the HEIRIT Preparatory Program with a chance to submit a proposal to PCIEERD for TBI funding assistance and become a part of the HEIRIT Universities for 2022-2024. The preparatory program will be spearheaded by the University of the Philippines Mindanao's UPGRADE TBI.










PSU Research Team presents externally-funded project to ATI

Policy makers, local government officials, members of the academe. salt manufacturers and salt farmers from all over the country gathered at the Sison Auditorium of Lingayen town in the province of Pangasinan to take part in the two-day event that serves as a hall mark of the University's leadership in development of salt processing and management through quality research, extension and innovation program.





PSU President Dr. Dexter R. Buted, said it is important to revive the Philippine salt industry which has languished despite having one of the world's longest shorelines and consequently take advantage of the global demand for sea salt.

"Ultimately, boosting the country's salt industry would not only benefit salt farmers and their families but also every Filipino

consumer and the local economy -while preserving traditional salt-making methods in the process," Dr. Buted said in his message.

The academic leader lamented that the country imports around 93 percent of its salt which is why PSU, as the only state-run university in the province of Pangasinan heeded to the call of revitalizing the rich tradition and identity of salt mining.

Pangasinan Governor Ramon 'Mon-Mon' Guico III said salt is important in life therefore it needs more attention, budgeting, research and participation from all stakeholders.

"I'm requesting all salt associations to unite for a vision where we will no longer need to import salt because there is enough supply, enough workers and



enough cooperatives," the governor said during the national salt congress.



















An overview of the salt industry was presented by Dr. Paulo Cenas, PSU Vice-President for Research, Extension, Innovation and Gender and Development (REIGN) while Mr. Gerard Khonghun, president of PhilAsin, discussed the PhilAsin Roadmap.

"Ang pangarap ng mag-aasin ay gumawa ng asin para sa Pilipinas," said Khonghun stating his dream for the salt industry.



Meanwhile, KABAYAN Partylist Repesentative Ron P. Salo, presented House Bill No. 1976 which stakeholders are pushing for the immediate passage.

Rep. Salo emphasized that this endeavor to revitalize salt is not only today as it has started a long time ago but is not given much attention.

"Our vision, hindi lang tayo maging salt-sufficient

but we will also become exporters of salt," he added.

The congressman thanked his fellow champions in the salt industry revitalization like the Pangasinan State University.

The Pangasinan State University partakes in the thriving Futures Thinking movement by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Philippine Futures Thinking Society (PhilFutures) in a webinar on Project Scoping for Futures Thinking and Strategic Foresight for Region I SUCs held on February 3, 2022 at the Board Room of PSU-Main Campus.



Spearheaded by Senator Pilar Juliana Pia Cayetano, the 'Futures Thinking' project was launched on May 12, 2020 by endeavoring to democratize 'Futures Thinking' in national policy-making and as a tool for effective planning during and after the new normal.

'Futures Thinking', as defined by th Asian Development Bank, is the theory and method that provides approaches to help identify emerging issues, negotiate uncertainties, identify scenarios, and formulate a vision of the desired future.



Recognizing the importance of building partnerships, particularly with State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) to achieve its goal in advancing new knowledge in the area of Futures Thinking and Strategic Foresight PhilFutures (FT&SF), established "polvlogues" where SUC representatives convene together in various venues and present their innovative ideas on Regional Futures plans.

PSU was one of the SUCs identified to be eligible for capacity-building on Futures Thinking by Sen. Cayetano, the chairperson of the Senate Committee on Sustainable Development Goals, Innovations, and Futures Thinking and was guaranteed by a government-granted budget of two million pesos.

The quest for quality assurance continues... PSU-LC UNDERGOES ONLINE INSTITUTIONAL ACCREDITATION

TO SECURE THE NICHE in academic and global competence and quality assurance, Pangasinan State University - Lingayen Campus (PSU-LC) submits itself anew to the first-ever online Institutional Accreditation (IA) - Level IV by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines Inc. (AACCUP) on January 31- February 4, 2022.

PSU-LC aspires for a Level IV Accreditation Status, the highest certification a State University and College (SUC) can achieve if it passes the quality assurance standards of AACCUP. Such recognition will be a big boost to the university in terms of SUC levelling, fund allocation, and in forging international linkages.

The team of accreditors, headed by Dr. Edgardo E. Tulin of Visayas State University, scrutinized the Lingayen Campus in nine areas, namely: governance and management (Area I); teaching, learning and evaluation (Area II); faculty and staff (Area III); research (Area IV); extension,















consultancy, and linkages (area V); support to students (area VI); library (area VII); infrastructure and other learning resources (area VIII); and quality assurance culture (area IX).

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic, PSU-LC marked a milestone in history by having consecutive weeks of virtual accreditation – a clear manifestation that the university fully embraced this noble endeavor.



Meanwhile, during the opening program last January 31 at Don Telesforo Bouquiren Convention Hall, PSU President Dr. Dexter R. Buted commended the members of the university workforce for their commitment in ensuring that the university attains quality and excellence in higher education despite the challenges posed by pandemic.

He also stressed the challenges of the accreditation survey on strong governance, operational efficiency, and outstanding instruction.














"Run the day, or the day runs you", Ms. Carelle stated, which was another remarkable quotation reminding everyone that it depends on the individual how he/she will start the day. "Never let the day run you because you might get tired and exhausted. Rather, run the day and make the most out of it".

After that, a topic on Developing Effective Facilitating Skills was delivered by Dr. Carl E. Balita the Chairman at CEB Group of Companies. Dr. Balita shared his thoughts and knowledge on enhancing

















effective facilitating skills, which is great help to all the employees of the Pangasinan State University.

Lastly, a discussion on Educator's Well-Being Challenges and Solutions was given by Dr. Linda A. Landicho a Clinical-Psychologist in LPU Batangas. Ending the talk with an amazing quote from Dr. Landicho, "Everyone is fighting a battle you know nothing". Therefore, in every situation, every individual must be sensitive and gentle in communicating with each other.

After those inspiring speeches from our notable speakers, the Chief Administrative Officer Dr. Ian D. Evangelista made his closing remarks, whereby he pointed out that those topics given were the top feedbacks from the survey conducted by the HRMDO among the PSU employees.

It was indeed a great, effective, and informative webinar which shows an interactive communication among the participants.

Learning How to Get Healthier and Better, Together




Concluding Day 1 was the awarding of certificates to resource speakers and the awarding of plaques and certificates of recognition to participants.

CHED-UniFAST revisits PSU implementation of TES and TDP Programs





















PSU launches AKKBAY program for out-of-school vouth

Cognizant of the mantra for education for all, the Pangasinan State University embarked on a massive education program to help the out-of-school youth (OSYs) get back to school and create job opportunities for them.

In partnership with the provincial government of Pangasinan and the local government units (LGUs), PSU launched the "Abot Kamay ang Kolehiyo: Isang Bayanihan (AKKBAY) para sa mga Out-of-School Youth" in Pangasinan on Tuesday, August 9, that aims to provide free, accessible and quality education and support services to the OSYs.

In his welcome remarks, University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted, expressed jubilation and



gratitude to all the stakeholders who attended the launch for being an "agent of hope for the outof school youth."

The university leader said he is deeply saddened with the alarming reality that one out of eight Filipino youth are out of school and engage in odds jobs because of the lack of education triggered by poverty.

Addressing the provincial government and members of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan present in the event, Dr. Buted said the way to solve this problem from the roots starts from home and the education systems, thus the need to solicit coopertaion and support.

"Sa ating mga kagalang-galang na miyembro ng Sangguniang Panlalawigan, hinihingi po namin na maipasa ang isang ordinansa na naglalayong suportahan ang AKKBAY program na siya namang pagtitibayin o ia-adopt sa lebel ng ating LGUs. Mangyari pong tulungan niyo kaming gabayan at bigyan ng isang makabuluhang hinaharap ang mga OSYs sa ating probinsya," Dr. Buted stated.



In response, Vice-Governor Mark Ronald DG. Lambino said the Sangguniang Panlalawigan welcomes the program as there is a need for enhanced level of collaboration between and among agencies for better, sustained and active engagement in all endeavors especially that he felt the burden of shifting from face-to-face classes to online learning during the pandemic.















Governor Ramon V. Guico III, represented by former Board Member Von Mark Mendoza, said he is equally happy with the start of a strengthened partnership with PSU.

"This program (AKKBAY) is very laudable. We will seriously look into this noble prgram of the PSU. The governor and the sangguniang panlalawigan are now your partners in the delivery of quality, world-calss education in the Philipines and in Asia," Mendoza said.





Meanwhile, Prof. Celeste Mercado, director for PSU's Student and Alumni Affairs and focal person for AKKBAY, said the program shall be open to out-of-school youth whose ages range from 18-30 years old in the province of Pangasinan who belong to the low-income or poor families. Seed money for the program is P5-million sourced from the Gender and Development Fund.



Three OSY grantees of the AKKBAY program also shared their elation onstage for the chance to go back to school after long years of temporarily setting aside education to work for their families.

A signing of commitment to support AKKBAY ensued.

Present during the event were municipal officials and social welfare and development officers of all 48 LGUs in Pangasinan, Sangguniang Kabataan federation presidents, OSY grantees and their parents.

Completing the event were the five Vice Presidents of the University, Campus Executive Directors and university officials.

hardworking workforce for without them, the institution would not rise to what it's worth today.

















PSU inks partnership with Center for Pangasinan Studies

Progressing towards inclusiveness, relevance and innovation, the Pangasinan State University is now a partner of the Center for Pangasinan Studies (CPS) side-by-side other Higher Educational Institutions in the province.



A Memorandum of Agreement signed on October 6, 2022 at the Urduja House of the Capitol Compound between and among the provincial government of Pangasinan led by Governor Ramon V. Guico III, the Center for Pangasinan Studies led by its Director Dr. Perla Legaspi and University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted, formalized PSU's involvement in the CPS.

The CPS is an institution established by the Local Government Unit of Pangasinan through Provincial Ordinance No. 198-2018 on July 18, 2016 in collaboration with the University of the Philippines, to serve as the primary research and development arm of the province.

Gov. Guico said CPS is one of the programs worth continuing and improving especially as its brings development to the province.

"Decisions must be evidence-based. CPS has an extensive area in research in so many disciplines. And these (researches) are vital as they help in decision-making," Gov. Guico said during the short program.



The Governor also urged the group to form a consortium in Pangasinan, gather the talents and be a part of the best to be competitive nationwide. He also opened the possibility of making a research study on Brgy. Malico in San Nicolas town as to the land domain of the province.

In response, Dr. Buted thanked the provincial government and the CPS in PSU's inclusion to the prestigious group as he enumerated the research development and innovation support activities that has earned recognition for PSU.



"We thank the governor who is also an academician kaya yung puso niya ay nasa sa academe, nasa edukasyon. We will support you in every way we can," Dr. Buted expressed.

PSU commits to be binded by the terms in the agreements which include: the collection, preservation and translation of existing documents, conduct workshops and

conferences, facilitate and advocate the integration of Pangasinan Studies in the curriculum of secondary schools and HEIs and provide technical assistance in the researches and scholarly pursuits of students that will foster knowledge creation, among others.















Other HEI-members of the CPS include: the University of the Philippines, Lyceum Northwestern University, PHINMA University of Pangasinan, Unibersidad de Dagupan, University of Eastern Pangasinan, University of Luzon and the Virgen Milagrosa University.

LGU-Pangasinan mulls creation of Medical School at PSU

In another unprecedented move, the provincial government of Pangasinan held initial talks with Pangasinan State University for the possible establishment of a Medical School in the government academic institution.



Governor Ramon V. Guico III announced the possible partnership during a gathering of some heads of Higher Educational Institutions at the Urduja House of the Capitol Compound.

The Governor said this is part of the province's preparation for the Universal Health Care (UHC) Law as he lamented the loss of medical practitioners in the province when

they seek jobs outside Pangasinan or overseas.

"Huwag nating pakawalan ang mga magagaling so they could work for the province," Gov. Guico said.

He went on to say that the government is subsidizing Php 1-Billion every year for hospitals, thus the need to be creative and think of more ways to augment income of the government.

PSU President Dr. Dexter R. Buted said a medical school that will support poor but deserving students, subsidized by the government that will lead to a 'Doctor to the Barrio' scheme is what is envisioned to be stablished with PSU.

"The intention of the governor is to provide free medical education for our learners so eventually when they graduate, they will serve the province. Hindi tayo makukulangan ng mga medical practitioners," Dr. Buted explained.

Dr. Buted added that providing great help for this scheme is the Commission on Higher Education's UNIFast program and the Tertiary Education Subsidy project.

Gov. Guico and Dr. Buted were quick to clarify that private schools offering medical courses will still be given same attention and help that they will be needing from the government.

PSU, the only higher educational institution, both public and private, to receive the Philippine Quality Award Level III for Mastery in Quality Management, does not stop



in finding ways to benefit more students to attain education advancement for all.

The TWG, led by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) of Region 1 arrived on October 13, 2022 at the Hospitality Management and Tourism Building of PSU with representatives from the University of the Philippines Resilience Institute, Philippine Institute of Environmental Planners (PIEP) North Luzon Chapter. Department Environment and Natural Resources -Environmental Management Bureau and Mines and Geo-Sciences Bureau (DENR-EMB/MGB). Department



Public Works and Highways (DPWH), National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA), Department of Budget and Management (DBM), Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB) and the Provincial Planning and Development Office (PPDO).

In a short program, University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted and other university officials welcomed the evaluation team led by the Over-all Chairperson Regional Director Dr. Danilo B. Bose of CHED RO1.















Dr. Buted said part of PSU's LUDIP milestones include the issuance of the land title of the Lingayen Campus after 42 years and the application of titling of five untitled campuses.

"PSU is also the first SUC in Region 1 to submit its LUDIP to the CHED Central Office. It is one of seven SUCs with a LUDIP in the country in 2021 and one of 25 SUCs with a LUDIP in 2022," the University President remarked.

PSU Director for Internal Audit System and University Focal Person of LUDIP Dr. Evangeline presented the university's journey, plans, and perspectives.

PSU receives five-star rate from DOE Initial Energy Audit

Attesting compliance to the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act, Pangasinan State University received a five-star rate in the on-the-spot check energy audit conducted by the Department of Energy (DOE) on October 19, 2022.

















The walk-through energy audit or on-the-spot check is a type of energy audit conducted in government facilities by the Energy Audit Team (EAT) of the Department of Energy, according to Patrick T. Aquino Ceso III, Director for Energy Utilization Management Bureau.

The Energy Audit program aims to ensure the implementation of Republic Act. No. 11285 - Energy Efficiency and Conservation, Enhancing the Efficient Use of Energy, and Granting Incentives to Energy Efficiency and Conservation Projects.

The Pangasinan State University was randomly selected by DOE alongside Inter-Agency Energy Efficiency and Conservation Committee (IAEECC) to undergo survey, audit, technical analysis, and other research or investigations related to energy efficiency projects.



The Audit Survey provided by IAEECC had three categories such as Office Policy, Best Practices for Electricity Conservation and Best Practices for Fuel Conservation. The PSU received a grade of A or perfect five stars rating, an excellent score for the three.

Present in the walkthrough energy Audit were Dr. Evangeline Pescador, Focal Person Internal Audit System Office, Dr. Claro S. Sison, Jr. Director for Physical Plant Facilities and Construction Management Office, Dr. Teddy Fernandez Coordinator for Energy Efficiency and Conservation Office, Mr. Rennie D. Martinez Director for Accounting Services Office, Mr. John F. Quinto Director for Supply Management Office, and Dr. Billy T. Festijo Director for Presidential Management and Liaison Office.

The University remains committed in advocacies undertaking sustainability of resources and in providing innovative alternatives for the common good of the community. PSU, led by President Dr. Dexter R. Buted, continues to provide quality education and services while ensuring responsible, efficient and effective leadership.

Saying THANK YOU to a man who has devoted his life for the welfare of Pangasinense students and employees will never be enough, thus the Pangasinan State University staged a tribute program for its outgoing, well-loved academic leader - Dr. Dexter R. Buted.



Dr. Buted, who is ending his second full term as University President of PSU on December 7, 2022, was met by his academic family with astounding cheers and enthusiastic claps upon his entrance to the Sison Auditorium, two days before he steps down from office.

A mob dance prepared by students greeted him where he joyfully danced with the PSUnians. This was followed by an ecumenical prayer from five religious sectors representing the multi-faith diversity present

in the PSU community.

Amidst audio-visual presentations and messages, special numbers from the Retirees group and children's sector were enjoyed by the audience.

A journey back in time when Dr. Buted applied for the PSU leadership was viewed in the program that transcended to the accomplishments and recognitions achieved by this internationally recognized academic institution.

Vice-President for Quality Assurance Dr. Marcelo Gutierrez lauded Dr. Buted's roaring spirit of a lion and his 'matapang na kape' brand of leadership

"Your name is synonymous with quality and excellence, congruent with being a dexterous leader, administrator and educator," Dr. Gutierrez said.

Dr. Corazon Puzon praised Dr. Buted for his unrivalled leadership while Dr. Manolito C. Manuel reflected that Dr. Buted gave the best times of his life to PSU.

"Some things may necessarily end no matter how good we are. Your term may have ended but all that you've done has no validity period," Dr. Manuel said.

Dr. Elbert M. Galas, the concurrent Vice-President for Administration and Linkages expressed his gratitude to the outgoing president for the entire eight years and the perceptible and substantial results of his sacrifices in making PSU remain at the top.

"From the time you have given me your trust and confidence and said 'kaya mo yan!', your convincing power and motivation made me realize how remarkable you are. You are the game changer that came at the right time and set the bar higher for us to follow, not settling for less," the incoming University President said.

Meanwhile, the crowd enjoyed a hearty laugh with a Fast Talk version hosted by Dr. Renato Salcedo where the president gamely answered questions from his professional and personal life.

Sanggunian Bayan and Panlungsod Resolutions and tokens of appreciation from the local government units of Alaminos, Binmaley and Infanta were also awarded during the program. LGU Lingayen and LGU Asingan on the other hand, awarded their SB Resolutions and token earlier.

Message also poured in from the group of Campus Executive Directors represented by Dr. Jenylyn Oboza of Alaminos Campus and from the University Officials network as represented by Director Celeste Mercado of the Student and Alumni Affairs.

A soulful rendition of spoken poetry was delivered by San Carlos Campus Executive Director Marie Claire Briones titled 'Paumanhin' while students from PSU Bayambang gave their piece of 'Paano Kita Mapasasalamatan."

In response, an emotional Dr. Buted remarked that his leadership had its highs and lows, victories and failures, doubts and confidence, criticism and validation but he did not give up.

"Ang nais ko lang naman ay makapag ambag ng makabuluhang pagbabago sa ating pamantasan. My mission to PSU was absolutely worth it. Eight years of my precious life I've given to PSU, masasabi kong ito'y naging makabuluhan. Walang nasayang," Dr. Buted said.

He said his love and care for the institution. faculty, employees and students was his motivation to continue his fight.

"Matapang kong haharapin ang pagtatapos

ng aking termnino. All I have is a jubilant heart that is overflowing with appreciation. Thank you, Pangasinan State University!" he added. (see full text of his farewell speech in separate post)

After his farewell speech, Dr. Buted staged a mini concert singing his selected songs with all employees thanking, hugging, crying and kissing him goodbye.

He ended the night by saying "This is Dexter Respicio Buted, your sixth University President, officially signing off."

Five presidentiables present vision for PSU in public forum

After eight years, the Pangasinan State University (PSU) opened its doors once again for a public forum to determine the next president of the academic institution.

The Search Committee Chairperson Dr. Lourdes F. Abadingo (who joined virtually) and Vice-Chair Dr. Ricmar P. Aquino led the committee members in welcoming the people from various sectors and stated that the public forum is one of the requirements in the process of choosing the next president. The other two being the panel interview and the search evaluation.



The five aspirants were introduced as: Dr. Adonis S. Bautista, Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, Dr. Christine N. Ferrer, Dr. Elbert M. Galas and Dr. Sally A. Jarin.

The Presidentiables presented their vision and mission for PSU as well as their strategic plans and development roadmap the for university before answering questions from representatives of

various sectors namely: administration (non-teaching personnel), alumni association, junior faculty, senior faculty, local government unit, private sector and students' association.

The second round of questions came from the people who attended the forum that were dropped in a transparent box. Each aspirant was asked to pick a question from the box which they have to answer in a span of two minutes.

Dr. Ferrer picked a question on equity, Bautista on gender development, Dr. Cenas on attributes of a president, Dr. Galas on 'no



collection policy' and Dr. Jarin on the number one problem that PSU is facing, which they all aced in answering.

Closing the public forum was a heartwarming message from outgoing University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted where he reminisced that he was in the same shoes as the aspirants eight years ago when he was an applicant for the PSU presidency.



"At the end of the day, my performance in the public forum will be rated at the end of my term. Moving forward, I believe that I was able to deliver my promises during that public forum," Dr. Buted said.

In his eight years as President of PSU, Dr. Buted also recalled the sad days in his reign when he was like a wounded soldier but

















emphasized that he never gave up, soared even higher and proved to his detractors that he was worthy of leading the university.

"Hindi mahalaga kung saan ang pinanggalingan mo, ang mahalaga ay ang totoong pagmamahal na ipinakita at ipinaramdam mo sa mga nasasakupan mo," he added.


Through all of PSU's accomplishments, recognitions and transformation, Dr. Buted said he was happy to note that the PSU community supported him all the way.

History unfolded once again as Pangasinan State University stood as witness to the Turnover Ceremony from the outgoing leadership to the incoming administration of the beloved academic institution.




Dr. Dexter Respicio Buted assumed as the 6th University President on December 9, 2014.



code.

PSUnians extend assistance to quake-hit Abra

The indomitable Filipino spirit coupled with compassion for the needy was once again manifested as the Pangasinan State University community joined hands to help the victims of the recent earthquake in Northern Luzon.

A fund-raising activity dubbed "Tulong sa Pagbangon" was launched by the University right after the 7.0 magnitude quake struck on July 27, 2022 to knock on the generous hearts of people in helping the kababayans.



The Research, Extension, Innovation and Gender and Development (REIGn) Division under the leadership of Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, through the Extension Services Unit supervised by Dir. Francis Albert T. Argente, and in partnership with the Alumni and Student Affairs unit headed by Dir. Celeste T. Mercado, raised a total of Php 103,927.00 with the help of the PSU community.

One of the most affected groups in the quake epicenter were the farmers tilling the rice terraces in Abra. Indigenous people tribes saw the devastation wrought by the quake, thus the need for assistance to recover.

















"More than their houses, the farmers were more worried of the erosion and destruction of the rice terraces. They lost their source of livelihood," University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted said.

Thus on August 11, 2022, the group of PSUnian researchers, extentionists and faculty embarked on a seven-hour land trip to the mountains of Abra to personally hand the donations and see their condition.

Notwithstanding the torrential rains that caused mud and erosion along the slopes during the



travel, the PSU group, in cooperation with Abra State Institute of Science and Technology (ASIST), arrived at their destination and provided assistance to the farmers of Masadiit Tribe in Bucloc, Abra.

"Relief goods and cash donations were given to the farmers' families from the proceeds of PSU's fund-raising activities. We are happy to

help," REIGn Vice-President Dr. Cenas said.

Aside from Dr. Cenas and Dir. Argente, also present during the event were GAD Director Gilbert P. Moralista, Research and Development Director Larry A. Santos, PSU-Asingan Campus Executive Director Armando D. Junio. Student Regent Christian M. Madarang, ASIST President Noel B. Begnalen and other faculty and non-teaching personnel from PSU and ASIST.



In return, the Masadiit tribe leaders thanked PSU President, Dr. Dexter R. Buted and ASIST President, Dr. Gregorio T. Turqueza, Jr. for the assistance extended to them by the two universities.

As the tribe's expression of gratitude, the Masadiits encouraged the PSUnians to dance their native dance to which they gladly obliged.

Although beset by strong natural disasters, the smiles on the faces of the quake victims depict that they can surmount any odds as long as helping hands are readily extended.

This Extension activity was held at PSU, Infanta Gymnasium and was attended by Bachelor of Science in Agriculture 3rd year students, Alumni of PSU Infanta who are venturing on rabbit production and the PSUs' Faculty & Staff.

The morning session was opened by Campus' Extension Services Coordinator, Dr. Dorothy Joy S. Noble delivering her welcome message for the participants and stating the purpose of the activity.



Afterwards a heartfelt message was delivered by the Campus Dean, Dr. Salvacion M. Vinluan, The first speaker Dr. Jocelyn S. De Vera, Extension Services Coordinator of PSU ACC has masterfully precedent the Salted Egg Production Training, an interactive session was made possible by doing hands-on steps on the procedure of the Salted Egg Production using the Brine Solution Technique. They ended the morning session by distributing IEC Materials for Salted Egg Production.



In the afternoon session our energetic speaker Dr. Ralph Kevin M. Espinosa, a Veterinary Services and Training Specialist in PILMICO centered his discussion on Rabbit Production and Management. He emphasizes on rabbit production, proper breeding, and proper health management. The event was ended by the closing remarks delivered by the Agriculture Department Chairperson, Prof. Wilma S. Noble.

The Pangasinan State University, through its International Affairs and Linkages Office (IALO), officially sealed partnership with INTI International University and Colleges in Malaysia during a ceremonial signing of memorandum of agreement (MOA).

The partnership aims to foster academic collaboration in education and to fortify cooperation in the advancement of key areas such as teaching and learning, employability, and research.



The MOA signing took place on January 26 via Zoom platform, with the leaders of the two institutions sealing agreement - PSU President Dr. Dexter R. Buted and Chief Executive Officer Chong Kok Wai of **INTI** International University and Colleges.

IALO Director Dr. Sally A. Jarin expressed her elation to the realization of the partnership after several months consultation. while Vice-President for Academic Affairs and Student Services

Manolito C. Manuel shared that forging academic partnerships with international Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) like INTI is a testament to PSU's commitment to its vision of becoming a premier state university in the ASEAN region.

Dr. Jesus Tinawin, vice-president for International Business Development of INTI, also shared how the initiative came about and how he is looking forward to executing the MOA's provisions.



















Under the agreement, the institutions will collaborate on efforts including Study Abroad Information Open Day, academic progression, placement and enrolment for Pre-University Foundation, diploma, Bachelor and Master, visiting scholar, as well as student and faculty exchange programs.

On January 24, 2022, the Pangasinan State University ioined a Special Webinar International Day of Education conducted by of Southeast Asian Ministers Education Organization (SEAMEO) with the theme 'Changing Course, Transforming Education,' divided into two sessions: Transformation in TVET Academic Mobility Programme and Transformation in Teacher Academic Mobility Programme.

Dr. Sally Jarin, the Director for Local and International Linkages, represented the Pangasinan State University, sharing a Report on Pangasinan State University Internationalization Initiatives during the Pandemic. Besides her, there were other speakers from Foreign Universities including the notable Keynote Speaker, Dr. David Atchoarena, the Director of UNESCO Institute of Lifelong Journey based in Germany.

According to Dr. Jarin, the report highlights the accomplishments, including the approval and implementation of the Credit Transfer Program, the Visiting Professor Program, the Virtual Practice

Teaching Program, and the Online Faculty and Exchange Program.

She also stated that the University pushed for the approval and implementation of its Visiting Professors/Lecturers program to continually enrich its students' learning experiences and integrate international context into their curriculum by utilizing virtual learning platforms.

Included in the talk were the opportunities brought about by the pandemic. Despite the opportunities, there were also issues, concerns, and challenges that emerged. These involve Language Barriers, Network Infrastructure and Technology and Training Concerns, and Global Curriculum and Accreditation.

As a matter of fact, the pandemic greatly affected everyone. Therefore, to survive and grow, everyone must accept and adjust to the global environment's unanticipated weaknesses, Dr. Jarin added.



University President Dr. Dexter R. Buted said in his message that the FabLab is the third SSF project of PSU

and its establishment entails the rapid adaptation of education with technology.

Asis G. Perez, turned-over the FRP boats to PSU officials.

Atty. Perez said the objective of the activity is to build and maintain a 30-footer FRP Patrol Boat. It also aims to increase awareness and develop interest among the state universities and local government units on FRP Boat as well as provide technical assistance in boat building.

The patrol boats will also be used to in safeguarding the waters of the province to ensure that no illegal structures will emerge.

Aside from the 30-footer FRP, PSU also received technical designs for a 19-footer fit for an inboard engine, a 19-footer fit for an outboard engine and equipment including a welding machine, compressor, and grinder.

In the Ilocos region where the university is situated, it is identified to be of "extremely high priority" and a "critical area" for marine conservation because of the presence of important marine and fisheries species are located and probably, where law enforcement and environmental governance oversight remain low.





On behalf of the University President Dr. Dexter Buted, the VP for Administration and Linkages Dr. Elbert Galas, said "My dear friends, the future of our oceans depends on our ability to achieve a far higher level of understanding of the current situation of our marine and coastal resources. We zoom in our lenses to identify problems that cause damage to the ecosystem and craft action plans and ensure their proper implementation. Lastly, we look into better or improved governance and policy response to the ocean and coastal issues".



SPES aimed to assist poor, but deserving, students and out-of-school youth to pursue their education by providing them income through employment. The program provides the youth with valuable experience for better school-to-work transition. Youth are employed for a minimum of 20 to a maximum of 52 working days where participating employers pay 60 percent of their













salary while the DOLE pays the 40 percent share based on the applicable minimum wage in the area. (Social Protection Org, 2017).

PSU-LC is continuing to take gigantic efforts to provide student services and accommodate the



needs of the students for undergraduate work experience and at the same time help them in pursuing their studies by providing them additional income through employment.
